What is a scholarship?

 A scholarship is an offering of FREE MONEY to a student based on the student's skills or qualifications.

Where do scholarships come from?

- The college/university
- Community Organizations/Businesses
- Private sponsors/donors

What types of scholarships are out there?

- Institutional (from college/university)
- High School Specific
- Clubs & Associations
- Military
- Credit Unions/Banks
- Career/College Major Specific
- Culturally Specific

Where can I find scholarships?

- Your high school
- Financial Aid Office
- Free websites:

Scholarship Databases

- Databases make locating/applying for scholarships easier.
- Create account/student profile with as much information about you as possible.
- Database matches you with list of scholarships that may apply to you!
- Read each scholarship carefully and apply for the ones you feel you may be eligible for.

How do I apply?

Get Organized! Things you may need to apply could include:

- Official/Unofficial Transcripts
- SAT/ACT Scores
- Letters of Recommendation
- Resume
- Written Essay

All scholarships are different and will have varying requirements. Pay close attention to the scholarship application instructions.

Top 10 Things Scholarship Committees consider:

- An application submitted ON TIME!
- General qualification, criteria and completeness
- Community volunteer involvement
- Leadership Experience
- Extracurricular Activities
- The Essay
- References/Letters of Recommendation
- Grade Point Average (GPA)
- SAT/ACT Scores
- Applicant's personal situation

Scholarship Tips

- Always be honest about your grades, test scores, experiences, memberships, qualifications, etc.
- Follow instructions CAREFULLY, an include all required components.
- Respect deadlines and apply early if possible.
- Proofread and always have at least one other person read your application/essays.
- Strive to set yourself apart. Be creative!
- Follow up to ensure your application was received.
- Send thank you notes!

Scholarship Scams

Avoid any scholarships/scholarship websites using the following ploys:

- "There is a small fee to apply for this scholarship."
- "Scholarship is guaranteed or your money back."
- "You can't get this information anywhere else."
- "Credit card or bank account number needed to hold this scholarship."
- "You've been selected to receive a scholarship."
- "First come, first served."

Final Thoughts

- Applying for scholarships can be time consuming, but can be well-worth your time.
- Remember to pace yourself. Set a goal for how many scholarships you wish to apply for!
- You can't win if you don't apply!
