

Campus Hazing Transparency Report

Reporting Period: January - June 2026

The Stop Campus Hazing Act requires higher education institutions to meet specific campus safety standards to participate in federal programs. This includes publishing a biannual Campus Hazing Transparency Report that details any student organizations found responsible for violating hazing policies. The Campus Hazing Transparency Report is maintained for a period of 5 calendar years. In full compliance with the Stop Campus Hazing Act, CBD College is deeply committed to transparency and accountability. The Campus Hazing Transparency Report outlines CBD College's official hazing policy and details all substantiated hazing incidents, including their final investigative outcomes.

Hazing Policy Statement

Hazing is abusive, degrading, psychologically damaging, and potentially life-threatening. It has zero tolerance at CBD College. CBD ensures a safe learning environment by providing comprehensive, campus-wide hazing prevention and awareness. While student groups help create a positive campus environment, they are expected to treat everyone with respect and adhere to the Student Standards of Conduct. Therefore, all forms of hazing by individuals or student organizations, both on and off campus, are strictly prohibited.

All violations of this policy shall be reported to the Chief Compliance Officer, or his/her designee, who shall report the violation to the appropriate law enforcement authority.

Definition of Hazing

The Stop Campus Hazing Act defines hazing as an intentional, knowing, or reckless act committed by a person (whether individually or in concert with other persons) against another person or persons regardless of the willingness of such other person or persons to participate, that is committed in the course of an initiation into, an affiliation with, or the maintenance of membership in, a student organization and causes or creates a risk, above the reasonable risk encountered in the course of participation in the institution of higher education or the organization of physical or psychological injury.

Definition of Student Organization

The Stop Campus Hazing Act defines a student organization as an organization at an institution of higher education (such as a club, society, association, varsity or junior varsity athletic team, club sports team, fraternity, sorority, band, or student government) in which two or more of the members are students enrolled at the institution of higher education, whether or not the organization is established or recognized by the institution.
